Information Table - Calendar


Prospective members would love to see the expected meeting dates well in advance before committing to a club! Having a tentative calendar ready to display during Freshman Orientation is very important and allows the students to know if they will be able to commit to Key Club. If you have any idea of when service opportunities may be offered, the calendar is a great place to mark them down.

Information Table - Overview and Service

Having a page filled with basic summarized information about Key Club and what we stand for is always a great idea!

Persuading Builders Club Members



What to include in your presentation:

- How to join
- When the meetings for your club are
- The possibility of moving from Key Club to Circle K
- Make sure to mention Key Club's values
- What traits they have shown as Builders Club members that would be useful in Key Club (dedication, kindness, etc.)





Visiting 8th Graders



Find the magic and fun Informing current eighth graders of Key Club is very important! Those eighth graders will be coming to high school, and they will be looking for clubs to join! Informing them of the many benefits of Key Club may persuade them to join your club over a club that did not personally visit them.

Asking Middle Schools to Let You Visit

In order to present to the eight graders, you will have to get permission from the middle schools. To do this, you could reach out to the principal or guidance counselors for the school. You can do so by finding their emails on the school's website or by asking your guidance counselors. Also, you could call the school and ask to speak to one of these people.

Social Medias





- Posts promoting kindness










Posters



Posters are an extremely useful recruiting tool. Students may see posters around school that make them curious enough to show up to a meeting!! Below are some examples of posters that you could put up.

High populated places you could them are:

- Near water fountains
- In the cafeteria (maybe near the line)
- Next to classrooms
- In courtyards or large gathering areas
- Next to bathrooms
- Near entrances







Using Your School Media



Lastly, do not be afraid to use the outlets that your school provides you. If your school has morning announcements, ask if you can go on one morning and show your Key Club pride! If your school has a newspaper, you could ask to have Key Club featured in that! If your school has a news show, ask to have a segment one week!
