HOW CAN KIWANIS HELP?

Delivering Hope and Health: Indiana District of Kiwanis has pledged \$1 million to establish a Maternal-Fetal Medicine Specialist Endowment to ensure that **every** mother and baby in Indiana has access to the best possible prenatal and postnatal care.

Riley Hospital is recruiting up to 12 maternal-fetal medicine (MFM) specialists to care for mothers with high-risk pregnancies. By making a gift to the endowment, you are providing enduring financial support for one of these physicians to address a shortage of care in our state, and to sustain and expand outreach to mothers and babies.

Due to the statewide presence of Kiwanis, you can:

- Raise awareness about Indiana's infant mortality rate and current efforts to improve it
- Educate your community about the "ABCs of Safe Sleep" to prevent sleep-related infant deaths
- Host at least one fundraiser for Riley annually at the local club level

Services Provided by Riley Maternal-Fetal Medicine Specialists

- Care for expectant mothers with high-risk pregnancies more than 13,000 patient visits across five locations in 2018
- Provide coordinated care to expectant mothers with known fetal anomalies through the Riley Fetal Center, which handled 200 referrals in 2018
- Offer training, education and support to hospitals and clinics across the state, targeting communities with high infant mortality rates
